the most important thing is to wear something you feel comfortable and confident in. how you feel about yourself is reflected in how your pictures turn out. whatever outfits you choose, own them! most grads tend to go for a dressier outfit, but if bringing 2-3 outfits, you have the opportunity to throw in a casual one too. i had a few grads recently who also brought traditional mexican and nigerian dresses - embrace what makes you you when choosing what to wear.

what should i bring?

- props! i had a few nursing grads fall 2018 who brought their scrubs, stethescopes, and textbooks for some cute photos. other fun props are champagne (to pop in the fountain), balloon bouquets (white and gold is a good color option if you don't know what to choose, with numbers to rep your class too), and confetti (the long, streamer kind that's easy to clean up).
- walking shoes if you're planning to wear heels, just bring an easy change of shoes for walking across campus so you don't get blisters and sore feet.
